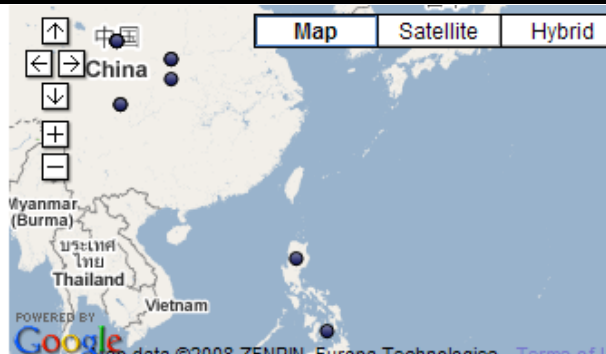

X'ian - Just One Day

X'ian, Shaanxi, China

At the risk of sounding cliché, my first day in Xi'an has been a bit like a rollercoaster ride. Fellow amusement-park-lovers can empathize-emotions ranging from fear to excitement, up and down, over and over...

My first venture was to simply get my bearings. The most daunting challenge is deciphering a language I cannot comprehend at all. Nearly everything is marked in Chinese characters, leaving me to hone my interpretation skills. And as English is not widely spoken, everything from buying a bottle of water to choosing a meal is infinitely more difficult. To order my first meal, I pointed to a picture on a menu, thinking it was chicken or pork. I could feel the eyes gazing at this silly American, the only person in the restaurant, trying to figure out what to do with his appetizers



and struggling to hold chopsticks correctly. While I ate, a little translation helped me to realize I was in fact eating squid (a surprise, yes, but it was pretty tasty).

I took some time to explore the history of the city. I began with the Bell Tower & Drum Tower, two ancient buildings that were used to signal time & approaching enemies when Xi'an's Ming dynasty ruled over China. Next: the "Great Mosque"-one of the oldest & largest mosques in China, providing a setting for Muslims to pray for over 1,250 years. Afterwards, I biked the 8-mile city wall, the most preserved city wall in China, also from the Ming dynasty. It was fascinating to see history come alive in these ancient relics.
