Culturally, I witnessed some of the quintessential Chinese culture portrayed by Hollywood that we often wonder, "Is that really true?" I saw rice fields, bicycle powered rickshaws and people carrying umbrellas to shade the sun. I had my first Chinese shopping experience, as I played the bargaining "game" for a digital watch. I ventured unknowingly into a gaming center, where hoards of teenagers mesmerizing played video games amidst endless rows of computer cubicles. And there were a few



hints of American cultural "gems, with Starbucks and McDonalds frequenting street corners.

Towards the end of the day, a combination of jet-lag fatigue, loneliness from lack of human connection and frustration hit me. Despite the discontent, hunger

compelled me to again brave the streets. As I trekked the pedestrian-packed "Muslim Quarter," the disarray overwhelmed me. I wanted to order food, but

my limited communication tool of pointing was no longer useful because the outdoor grills required you to choose a combination of meats, sauces and teaching job, after which I will vegetables-most of which were all foreign to me. Finally I set aside my fear and approached a stand. After attempting some broken Chinese, the owner sat me down But for now, I'm going to bed. and fed me an assortment of

delicious roasted beef kebab, dumpling soup, vegetable paomo and plum juiceall for less than \$3! As I enjoyed the meal, goofily nodding and smiling at the staff, the children began

to grab and read my list of Chinese translations. And I couldn't help but laugh-how silly it was to fear such a simple

Phew. I expect many of my upcoming days will be much of



the same-confusion and excitement intermingled to create prime learning experiences. For the next three days, I will be training for my travel to Ankang to begin that new venture. Once I am settled in Ankang, I will likely set up a blog so you can track my experiences. Zaijian!


