Scaling the stairwells, I use my arms to hoist me upwards by the chain-link handrails. Nearly every ten steps forces a rest. I think of my family.

I rest at a home. The storeowner invites me to sit, points to where I am on the

map. A hodgepodge of hikers, young and old converse loudly. I can comprehend only their laughter and their huffs and puffs. I smile, not, laugh , and use my preschool Chinese phrases to show I am trying.

Go again!

10:30 PM: I don't need a break right now, but I can't help but stop. I am reclining upon a rock

as I stare into the night. Bird chirps and from peeps echo off the mountains; voices of fellow night-trekkers intermittently float through the air. A distant full moon peeks

through tiny silver streaks of clouds. I breath in a fresh, clean breeze. Tranquility in its purest form.

I gaze at the mountain in front of me. It looks like Paul Bunyun, supersized, fast asleep, Black, curly hair, a fluffy logger's beard,

wrinkles sculpt his forehead, and an arm slouches, creasing his shirt. Fast asleep, silent, at peace.

I can't help but wonder, What if this were it? What if these were my last

moments on earth? Well, before I passed, there would be one last-minute request:

Think about me and smile. Laugh at my memorial. Remember trampolines, yearbooks, the Outer Banks. But most importantly, don't let my messages die. Nourish them forever, carry on the legacy I adopted from others. Do all you can to continue their spread. Enjoy



life. Serve others. Be happy. And love, love, love. Find it in everything, harness it, keep it, never let it escape. A life without perpetual love is a life not worth living.
