Gambling Chinese Cuisines

Chinese food. One of the starkest differences from America. Breakfast, lunch and dinner do not often separate cuisines-you eat the same things throughout the day. Group meals place an assortment of platters on the spinning Lazy Susan, as everybody dips into each dish with their chopsticks. Some of the food from American Chinese restaurants is the same, but there is a lot to be left to the imagination...

For your interest, I have recorded some of the more interesting foods I have tasted on my journey:

(First tour of cuisines)

7/9/08: Korean-Chinese Barbeque. As I sit, raw meats and vegetables are placed upon the miniature grill on my table. An arrangement of beef, pork, chicken, sardines, squid and a range of veggies are served to me directly from the grill, to dip in a variety of sauces waiting at your plate. Quite tasty!



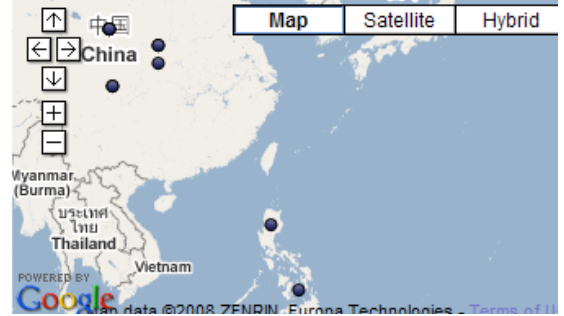
7/12/08: A Black-Bean Meal. Served at a place my Western friends call the "Black-Bean Restaurant" (because everything is cooked with black beans). We ordered fried pumpkin, fried garlic and cabbage pancakes, and fried beef, mushrooms and onions-all with black beans, of course!



7/13/08: Hot-Pot. A flame is lit at every chair, and pots of spicy broth are placed on top. When my pot begins to boil, I sample the many cuisines in front of me. Lamb meat; roots, tree leaves, mushrooms and lettuce; grain and vegetable noodles; and the most bizarre platter: Duck Blood, served in Jello-mold chunks.



7/16/08: The Ankang Breakfast. I was served the favorite breakfast in Ankang today. It is a plate of cold spaghetti-like noodles, served with green vegetables, yellow beans, and, of course, the spicy Ankang sauce-a sauce so popular, it sits where our salt and pepper would.



7/26/08: The Farmer's Meal. Sitting in a remote lake island, we are served what's called "Farmer's Food." Plates galore, offering new foods to gamble on. Spicy chicken and vegetables (the chicken feet had an interesting texture); fresh fish; tree moss ((it's "good for my lungs"); beans, greens, roots, potatoes, soup and, of course, rice.
