English & Chinese: Merging Culture by Teaching
Ankang, Shaanxi, China

I'm teaching at Aston English, a Chinese private school known for its western-style education and native English teachers (www.astonenglish.com). It's unique, interesting and fun to teach at, and overall, I've been having a very valuable experience.

First, a bit of background about China's education system. Childhood education is about as rigorous as striving towards partner in an American law firm. Inauguration is at preschool-age, when parents begin pushing their children to learn as much as possible. The ultimate goal is for inclusion in the elite 11% of freshman-aged students who are accepted into college. The growing population doesn't help the teacher-student ratio: many public schools have over 100 students per class. After school, children work in hours of homework between sports games and piano lessons, with barely

any break until midnight. Weekends are not relaxation time—they're there for extra lessons and classes. Aston English provides one of those "extra" learning classes.



I teach six classes. Four aged 6-8; one aged 12-13; and one aged 15-18. I love them all. The children are adorable; simply having them stand up gets them excited. Now that they know me, when I peek in the classroom, students pop up in their seats, eyes wide, ready for me to slam open the door with my thunderous "Hellooooooo!" I can't help but smile as the kids giggle at every mistake in Simon Says, jumble tongue twisters in turbo-speed, and hold their tongues to mimic the English "th" sound. And every Thursday, they never fail to remind me of their weekly magic trick.

For my younger classes, a Chinese-speaking teacher is present during my lessons, to help with translation and struggling students. However, I try to use translation only when

absolutely necessary. Aston's goal is for the kids to understand and use spoken English through the guidance of a native tongue (an advantage rarely found in public schools). I use movements to express my language, mimicking words like "look, listen and repeat" with my eyes, ears and mouth (and after two weeks, they're already able to say these words themselves—accompanied of course by proud giggles of accomplishment).

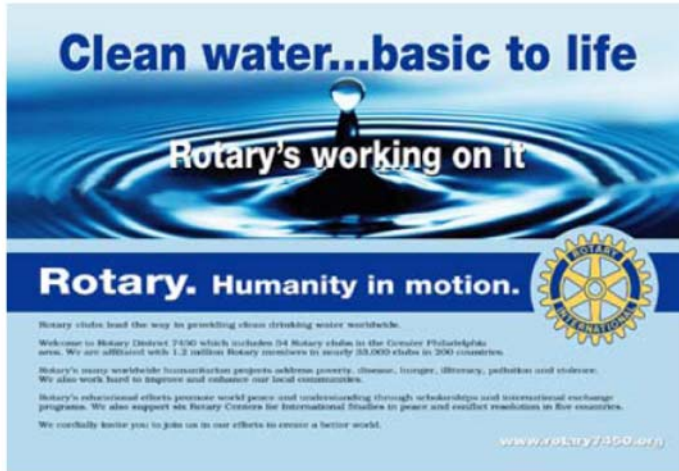
District receives \$6,000 PR grant for ads at Philadelphia Airport baggage areas

Rotary District 7450 has received a \$6,000 public relations grant from Rotary International which will be added to \$2,000 District 7450 funds to finance an unprecedented five-month-long advertising campaign at the Philadelphia International Airport as of January 1.

"This promises to be a powerful effort to get out the message of what Rotary is all about," said DG Chesney. "For the second consecutive year, we will have two state-of-the-art colorfully lighted displays located in the heavily-trafficked baggage pickup area of US Airways at an airport that is the fifth busiest flight gateway of the United States. More than two million passengers pass through the Philadelphia Airport each month.

"Each of these eye-catching publicity pieces offers a wonderful tribute to what Rotary does around the world and hopefully will even recruit new members to our cause."

"Our District 7450 project involves the use of two different 43 inch by 62 inch lighted and full-color billboard graphics called dioramas that will be



displayed in a busy baggage area of USAirways," explains Philadelphia Rotarian Joe Batory, who designed the ads using Rotary International Humanity in Motion themes of "Clean Water" and "Polio Prevention" with help from RI staff. "We have some tightly written explanatory copy on each eye level diorama that welcomes airport passengers to the Rotary Clubs of District 7450, tells them a bit about what Rotary does worldwide and locally, and invites interested persons to join a Rotary club," Batory adds.

The District 7450 diorama advertisements will be displayed until May 31, 2009.



An added bonus is the decision by Clear Channel, the national company that handles the advertising at the Philadelphia Airport, to provide two dioramas for the price of one in recognition of the humanitarian efforts by Rotary Clubs.

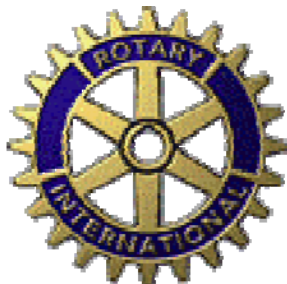
