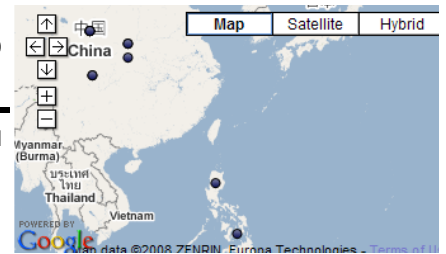

Proceeding to thrust the long needle into my ear, he vibrated the tuning fork against it, buzzing this foreign fuzzball in my eardrum. He asked, "Feels good?" to which I nodded out of sheer ignorance and bewilderment. After he stuck a few more utensils into my ear, I deciphered his ear-cleaning

intentions and firmly stated my disinterest in Chinese: "No!" Apparently thinking I was fool enough to believe him deaf, he continued to borrow into my ear, all the while parrotting: "Feels good? 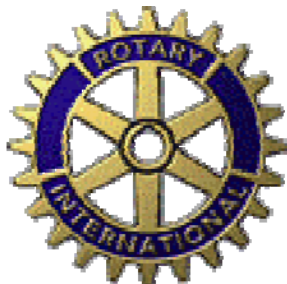
