Chengdu, China

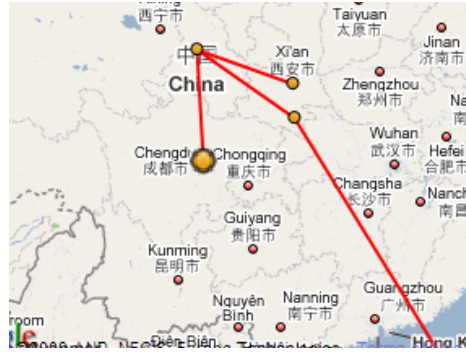

Simultaneously in Chinese history, calligraphy has functioned as a prominent art form. It is fascinating to think that writing words on paper — something we do every day — is viewed as *art*. Famous historical calligraphic works are displayed throughout the country, paralleling western popularity of Renaissance art. In Du Fu’s park, a glass case holds calligraphy inscribed on stone, drawn by a prince of the Qing dynasty. It is remarkably simple to my uncultured eyes — and yet it holds such fame and respect. Still today, calligraphy is enormously popular. It adorns walls in businesses and homes, in the

spaces where we would put pictures of landscapes or family photos. And wealthier families sometimes invest in more valuable works: for a bit of higher price, you can get “authentic ancient Chinese messages, blessing your home or buiness with luck or fortune.

It is truly fascinating to delve into a world history so different from ours, and I still find myself bemused by the vast disparity. It reminds me of what makes our world so beautiful — that while we are so similar, we are also so very different.
