April 8 - John Stauffer - Teaching in Eritrea

Topic: Teaching in Eritrea

John Stauffer will share he experience being a teacher in Eritrea in the 1960s; Beginning in 2004, John and several others formed The America Team for Freedom for Eritrea to create awareness, particularly in the US government, of the problems facing most Eritreans because of the cruel Eritrean regime. The Team launched www.FreeEritrea.org and began helping refugees that have fled the country. John will explain how the Team has recently left political activities and focused its efforts on helping refugees in Ethiopia and the US, having re-established itself as The America Team for Displaced Eritreans. Resettlement of Eritrean refugees in Delaware County is part of the story.

John was raised in Wallingford, PA, and attended Nether Providence Schools and York College and Juniata College. Following graduation, he served as as a Peace Corps teacher in Eritrea (then a part of Ethiopia) in NE Africa. Following a 38 year career with Rohm and Haas Co., he got involved with efforts to help address the cruelty and rapacity that the new Eritrean regime has visited upon the people of that country -- living there and in the US and other countries.
