Rotarians line up to donate!



The Media Rotary Club has raised over \$2,000 in its recently completed 50/50 campaign. These funds will be donated to numerous locally based organizations to benefit the community in which we live and do business.



Rotarian Pat Kosinski couldn't be more happy at the generosity of the fund-raising effort which netted over \$2,000.



Anthony J. "Don" Donatoni, President Aqua Wastewater Management spoke to Rotary about Aqua, PA's performance and plans to improve their service, expand their business model and serve it's community. In Media, Aqua PA has replaced over 10 miles of pipe at a cost of \$10M. They purchased the Wastewater Plant and have spent nearly \$2.5M on capital improvements since 2004. They are preparing to accept additional flow from the public sewer systems currently under construction in Upper Providence.

Five years ago Aqua PA started a non-regulated business called Aqua Resources. This new business provides a variety of water and wastewater services for thousands of residential and commercial customers as well as performing work under municipal contracts Septic Tank pump-outs, Sanitary sewer tie-ins and more



Margaret "Peg" Hendricks, Executive Director Delaware County Community Foundation spoke to Rotary about DCCF whose mission is to foster local philanthropy by assisting members of our local community to fulfill their charitable objectives through lasting legacies and to provide support to meet local needs that improve the quality of life for residents of Delaware County. DCCF raised over \$1,000,000 and given more than

\$805,000 in grants to organizations and services across the County. Supported during the first three years with consultants and part-time help, DCCF hired our first full-time executive director in 2008 and has set a \$10,000,000 goal to secure the future for DCCF. On November 20, 2010 DCCF will hold its 5th Anniversary Gala at Springfield County Club.

Joe graduated from Villanova with a degree in engineering but when he was hired by GE and was offered either a drafting position "or"....he chose the "or" when he learned that he would have to spend at least half his career hunched over a drafting table. That wasn't for Joe. He was told that the "or" in this case was to become a Sales Engineer in the Marketing Department. Joe never looked back but set his sites on seeing the world and selling GE's power plant products in a highly technical and competitive business. He packed his bags to go where his markets were: The Middle East, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, etc. In 1978, Joe's life was rocked when he was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis. Joe soldiered on with this debilitating disease for another 9 years at Sun Shipbuilding before retiring in 1987. 15 minutes doesn't give nearly the amount of time to hear all of Joe's fascinating stories. He could easily have held our attention for hours.

Susan Garrison



...grew up in Delaware County with a love of Latin and History. She earned a degree in Sociology from Gettysburg College. Susan's role as executrix of her mother's estate started her foray into law and ultimately led her to Villanova Law School for a J.D. and an LL.M. in Taxation. In 1986 she established her own practice in Media and focuses her practice on nonprofit law, estates and estate planning. In 1994 she co-founded The Center Foundation and started WomenCare and the Young Parents Support Network which have mentored over 700 women with the help of volunteers

who dedicate one year to meeting one-on-one with women in transition and teen parents. Susan tries to live her life with a philosophy she learned from her brother, Bruce, who passed away in May, "Live your life with passion and nurture your relationships with the people you have with you today."

The Delaware County Criminal Investigation Division (CID) which is the investigative branch of the Office of the District Attorney of Delaware County, has made it a priority since 1984 to address the matter of child abuse in Delaware County. The first step was to form a child abuse unit that would work closely with the Children and Youth Services/Sexual Abuse Unit. The CID Child Abuse Unit began with two detectives and a Sergeant and now has four detectives and a Lieutenant.

Edwin "Ted" Erickson is a Republican member of the Pennsylvania State Senate who has represented the 26th District since 2001 after filling the unexpired remainder of Joe Loeper's term. He served from September 17, 2001 until July 15, 2008 as the federal prosecutor responsible for the city of Philadelphia and its eight surrounding counties. Meehan is currently a candidate in the 2010 U.S. House election for Pennsylvania's 7th congressional district, seeking the seat being vacated by Guy Sestak. He will face Bryan Lentz, the Democratic Party nominee in the November General Election.

Vicki Conteh graduated from Baptist Bible College in Springfield, Mo. in May 1995. Guy Gundaker, 13th President Rotary International 1923-24.

Born 1873 Died 1960. Until his retirement, Guy Gundaker was President of Kugler's Restaurant in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was born in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, attended the Universities of Cornell and Pennsylvania, and was admitted to the bar in 1902.

The Gundaker Foundation was established in 1964 to honor the life-long accomplishments of Guy Gundaker, a charter member of the Rotary Club of Philadelphia. As the charitable arm of district 7450, Gundaker provides educational grants to undergraduate and graduate students, and also provides matching grants for the projects of local clubs. In addition, Gundaker supports the Youth Exchange program. Approximately 85% of all funds distributed by this Foundation remain within our District.

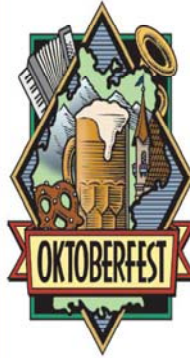
This is a great time to be a Rotarian. Together we can make this century of service even more exciting than the last!
