



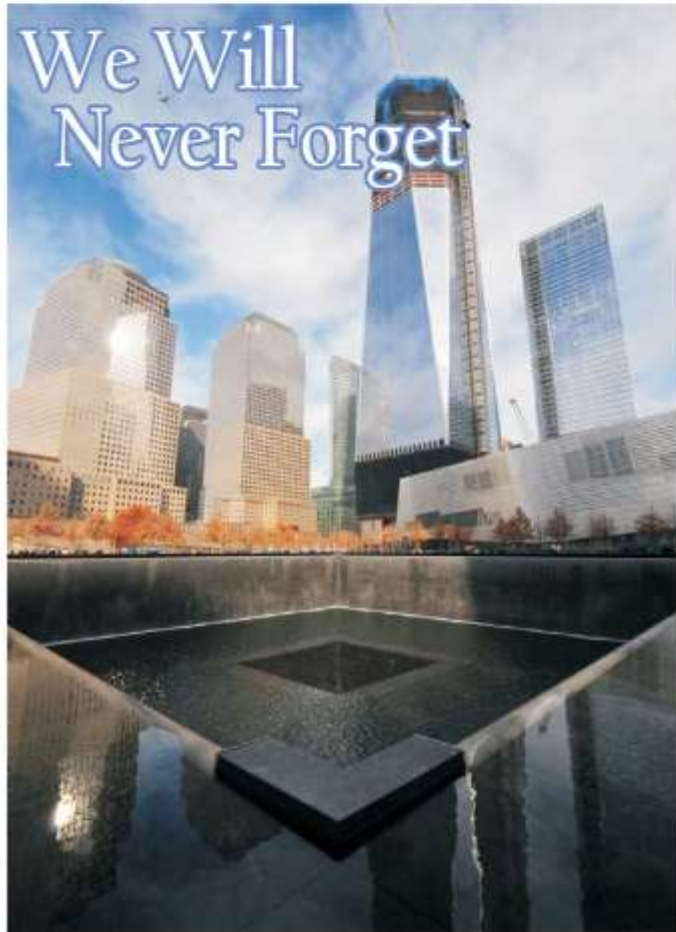

JOE SOLOMAN - UPPER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP



Joseph Solomon is currently the Chairman of Upper Providence Township Council, having served on Council since 2010. Joe has been very actively involved in Township matters for about 16 years now, having previously spent 8 years on the Planning Commission (6 as Chair) and 2 years as Chair of the Township's Comprehensive Plan Task Force. His primary efforts as a Council representative have been fiscal responsibility, safety and security, traffic and transportation, and growth management. In January of 2015, Digital First Media has announced that Peg DeGrassa was named Senior Editor of the Delco News Network group of seven weekly newspapers. LETTER TO INQUIRER: PRIEST'S KILLING VIOLATES ISLAMIC BELIEFS

Dr. Madeel Abdullah of Newtown Square wrote this letter to the editor (Phila Inquirer) a few weeks ago about Islam and it's relationship to other faiths.

Priest's killing a sin. Two men, purportedly "soldiers of the Islamic State," killed an 85-year-old priest in Normandy, France, Tuesday ("France recoils at priest killing," Wednesday). The prophet Muhammad commanded, in a covenant with St. Catherine's monastery, that Christians should not be "offended or disturbed or coerced or compelled."

In Islam, Christians are considered "People of the Book" and must be treated with respect and justice. Tuesday's attack was by definition un-Islamic, and this radical group needs to be stopped.

The head of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, Mirza Masroor Ahmad, has said that we need to cut off the funding to these groups.

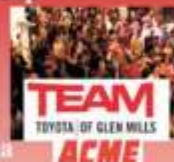
